## Description of the State Board of Behavioral Health and Developmental Services

Per § <u>37.2-200</u> of the Code of Virginia, the State Board of Behavioral Health and Developmental Services is a policy making body, within the meaning of § <u>2.2-2100</u>, authorized to promulgate public policies or regulations for the department, state facilities, and CSBs and BHAs. The department operates under the supervision of the Secretary of Health and Human Resources. ## Department

Title 37.2 of the Code of Virginia establishes the Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Services (DBHDS) as the state authority for the behavioral health and developmental services system for individuals and their families whose lives are affected by mental health or substance use disorders or a developmental disability. The department is authorized by:

- Chapters 3 (§ <u>37.2-300</u> et seq.) and 7 (§ <u>37.2-700</u> et seq.) of Title 37.2 of the Code of Virginia to operate DBHDS hospitals, training centers, and other facilities (state facilities); and
- Chapters 5 (§ <u>37.2-500</u> et seq.) and 6 (§ <u>37.2-601</u> et seq.) of Title 37.2 of the Code of Virginia to fund and contract with community services boards (CSBs) and behavioral health authorities (BHAs) for the purposes of establishing, maintaining, and promoting prevention, early intervention, treatment, and habilitation services and supports.
