Description of Agency or Boards

The Department of Medical Assistance Services is the single State Agency in the Commonwealth of Virginia that administers the Medicaid program under Title XIX of the Social Security Act and the Children's Health Insurance Program (known as FAMIS) under Title XXI of the Social Security Act. The Code of Virginia § 32.1-325, grants to the Board of Medical Assistance Services the authority to administer and amend the Plan for Medical Assistance and to promulgate regulations. The Code of Virginia § 32.1-324, grants the Director of the Department of Medical Assistance Services the authority of the Board when it is not in session.

Brief Overview The 2022 Appropriations Act, Item 304.ZZ, directed the Department to promulgate a regulatory change concerning post eligibility special earnings allowance for individuals in the Commonwealth Coordinated Care Plus, Community Living, Family and Individual Support and Building Independence waiver programs to incentivize employment for individuals receiving waiver services. The Department must lower the number of hours from at least eight hours but less than 20 hours per week requirement to at least four hours but less than 20 hours per week for a disregard of up to 200 percent of Supplemental Security Income and a disregard of up to 300 percent for individuals that work 20 hours or more per week. Brief Overview This regulatory action incorporates the requirements of HB2137, which passed during the 2021 General Assembly. These regulations provide a paid sick leave benefit to attendants who provide personal care, respite, or companion services to Medicaid-eligible individuals through the consumer-directed model of service. The consumer-directed model is currently available for those services in the Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnostic and Treatment (EPSDT) program, Medicaid Works program, and three of Virginia's four 1915(c) Home-and-Community-Based Services Waivers: Community Living, Family and Individual Supports, and Commonwealth Coordinated Care Plus.
