Description of Agency or Boards

The State Board of Elections ("Board') is authorized to prescribe standard forms for voter registration and elections, and to supervise, coordinate, and adopt regulations governing the work of local electoral boards, registrars, and officers of election. The Department of Elections ("ELECT") is authorized to establish and maintain a statewide automated voter registration system to include procedures for ascertaining current addresses of registrants; to require cancellation of records for registrants no longer qualified; to provide electronic application for voter registration and absentee ballots; and to provide electronic delivery of absentee ballots to eligible military and overseas voters. The Department conducts the Board's administrative and programmatic operations and discharges the Board's duties consistent with delegated authority.

Brief Overview			
House Bill 1238 from Virginia's 2020 General Assembly Session instructs the State Board of Elections			
to promulgate regulations for the implementation of the bill's provisions as it relates to print media			
requirements. The purpose of this new regulation is to guarantee that disclosure statements on			
certain political print media advertisements are displayed in a conspicuous manner and are			
proportionate to the size of the advertisement. The requirements in this proposed amendment are			
similar to federal print media advertisement requirements established by the Federal Election			
Commission under 11 CFR § 110.11. The enforcement of this regulation is delayed until January 1,			
2024.
